
From an early age exploring our local area can be so much fun! For this visit we are staying local and going to visit Longton Park.

#### Reception Autumn 1

Reception will start their new topic of 'Fee Fi Fo Fum' with a trip to Trentham Garden Centre. The children will get to purchase new plants to bring back to school to add to their very own garden centre role play areas... how tall will our beanstalks grow?! 
#### New Brighton Beach Reception Summer 2

#### BRAMPTON TOY MUSEUM




Year 1 - Topic 1


This trip will be a fun morning out of school encouraging the children to share and take turns as well as develop the Geographical skills.

Year 2

Topic 3

Through this topic children learn about the differences in Nature and how the natural world is so vast and so different, whilst also learning about habitats and animals who come out at night! This overnight stay mixes all of the curriculum objectives with first hand learning as well as developing confidence, social skills and independence.

- Children begin with travelling around in different ways, just like animals, on the aerial trek with rope climbing activities.
- Then let's take on the rope course to see how agile we are!
- The day is then complete with a night time camp fire, where children can here the scurrying and calling of the nocturnal animals. Let's beckon the nocturnal animals with a good sing song around the camp fire.

#### MANCHESTER AIRPORT

Part of the Early Years Curriculum is to develop children's understanding of the world around them and the topic of 'Holidays' is sure to get them thinking about just how big the world is!

YEAR 2

TOPIC 4

Located off the main airport site children get to do the following:

- · View modern aircraft landing and taking off-including the super-jumbo A380 which brings a large gust of wind with every take off and landing! (Depends on the flight schedule)
- · Take part in a workshop on board a former Monarch Airlines aeroplane: children get to have their passports stamped (provided), take on the roles of different people on the aeroplane and this includes fully costume to dress up in!
  - · Go on-board some retired aircraft to see what air travel was like in the past and is like now · Get to see the supersonic British Airways jet: Concorde!
- · Put on a captain's hat and sit in the flight deck of a former aeroplane and pretend they are flying somewhere exotic!


Of course, we make sure there's time for a play on the adventure playground and a picnic lunch too!





As part of our history topic 'How Stoke has changed' we start off by delving in to what WE are famous for - pottery - by visiting Middleport Pottery. This has been the home of Burleigh Pottery since 1889 which means the children will get a real sense of Stoke-on-Trent's celebrated history. This visit involves a factory tour, enjoying a clay workshop and being taken on a heritage trail looking at the bottle kilns and Victorian offices. On top of this, we take a trip to two sites in our local area to see first-hand how these sites have changed over time.

### YEOR3 Topic 3



### A Visit to Llandudno

Topic 4

Our final trip of the year, involves enjoying a fun-filled day out at Llandudno – centred around the beach! A tram ride to the summit of the Great Orme will give the children spectacular views. The children will learn about the coasts of the British Isles. They will consider the advantages and disadvantages of living by the coast and how Britain's coasts have changed over the years. But most important of all the children will make memories with their friends at the beach (and of course with an ice cream!).





#### Liverpool World Museum

Children will be taken on a journey through 5000 years of human life in the Nile Valley. Whether it's learning about ancient burial practices, exploring Egypt's relationship with other civilisations, or reading spells from the Book of the Dead, the gallery will give THEM a flavour of what it was like to live in Ancient Egypt. The exhibition tells the story of Liverpool's connections with excavations carried out in Egypt and Sudan, and how thousands of artefacts became part of the World Museum collection. Around every corner there lurks a new and fascinating piece of History to explore and learn from but be careful not to wonder off as there are mummies living here! Having visited the museum, we will also have time to walk around Liverpool and take in the sights and sounds of the city.

Where better to visit (apart from Rome!) than the historic town of Chester as we delve into Roman Britain as part of our next History unit. Could a Roman have lived where I live now? We will be immersed in the sights, sounds and smells of Roman Britain and the fortress that was once home to the Twentieth Legion, 5,000 vicious and brave men. We will also visit the award winning 'hands-on' room where we will explore a variety of activities from trying on Roman armour to creating a mosaic to firing a catapult! This fully immersive trip will be both fascinating and thrilling and bring Roman Britain back to life.

#### London Residential Year 4 - Topic 4

We may have waited until the end but it's finally here... Year 4's residential to London! As part of our Geography unit, we will be looking at water and how the water cycle works and so a visit to London to see the Thames is in order. Also, we will be studying the amazing Gangsta Granny this half term and so we can go and see the crown jewels... before she steals them.

As well as staying overnight in the Capital, we will be doing the following:

- A Tour of the Tower of London including the Crown Jewels, seeing where prisoners were taken in from the riverside entrance
- A clipper boat ride along the River Thames
- A flight on the London eye
- A short walk from the London Eye down the Mall to Buckingham Palace, seeing Trafalgar Square on the way
- A visit and behind the scenes tour of the Royal Mews in Buckingham Palace.

#### A VISIT TO THE PEAKS






#### CLIMBING AT AWESOME WALLS!

## YEAR 6 TOPIC 1








What better way to really understand the upheaval of the World War than to relive some of the hardest experiences first hand.

The children will experience a real life evacuation from the school grounds, take a steam train to the countryside and stay over night as an evacuee. The children will learn how to cook from basic rations and keep safe whilst still being children!!!











One of the most exciting places for children is Disneyland and Paris is within our travels. The adventure starts early on Monday morning and doesn't end until Friday evening. The accommodation for the week is one of Disney's 4 star hotels–The Explorers, with bedrooms equipped with full en-suite facilities and enough room to sleep 4 or 5 children. Thursday–full day out to the Disneyland Park followed by a fun packed evening at Plaza Gardens Restaurant followed by the magical fireworks ,laser and water show. A final shop can be had as we make our way back to the hotel.
