RKR-Thursday

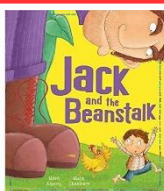
Please can children wear P.E kit to school on their P.E day.

Jack and the Beanstalk

Our class text this half term is 'Jack and the Beanstalk'

Reception will be introduced to traditional tales through the story of 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. Children will develop their questioning skills through an exciting enquiry... to discover where the enormous footprints have come from. They will learn lots of new vocabulary with the help of our class wizard 'Whizzy!' and through re-telling the story using a story map and actions.

In Maths, we will be solving everyday practical problems to embed our early knowledge of number and will be comparing length and height of objects. Children will explore shape and pattern through manipulating shapes to create their own colourful pictures.

In Science, we will be finding out about the life cycle of a bean, growing our own beanstalk and recording its progress using a weekly bean diary.

Reading is an essential part of the learning journey at The Crescent Academy. Your child will read every day with an adult. It is essential that your child has their reading book and diary in school every day. We use the diary to communicate with you about your child's reading progress.
