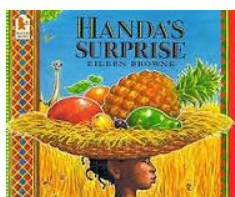

Our class story is 'Handa's surprise'

Through our class story we will be learning about Handa's surprise. We will discuss the different exotic fruits and the different animals from this we will retell the story accompanied by actions. We will be exploring the story vocabulary through linked activities, such as exploring the different textures and tastes of the exotic fruit!

In Maths, we will be continuing to explore number bonds to 10, using kebab sticks and exotic fruit as manipulatives. We will also be exploring tally charts at the airport and we will also have our own ice cream parlour in which we will be using pictorial charts to compare and answer mathematical problems!

In Topic sessions we will be using our fine motor skills to weave baskets, collage, print and paint! We will also be mixing colours in order to experiment with warm and cool colours.
